	The service does not currently have any volunteers actively supporting at meetings, it	
	was suggested that this data should not be included on the statistics until there are

	volunteers. Most of the people trained to volunteer have dropped out shortly after completing the training or have been unavailable when the opportunity to support at a	
	meeting is offered. Many meeting requests have been too short notice or too complex for	
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The Impartiality policy needed the date of document at the end. The review date on the confidentiality policy should be June 2024. There was a query about the impartiality policy describing young people as those over 16 years of age and whether this is affected by the national increase to compulsory school age. The SEND Code of Practice defines a young person as being over 16 years of age however there are changes planned for the SEND Code of Practice in March. The policy will need to be reviewed sooner if the changes in March affect this definition. Kerry will discuss this with the national IASS network at the next regional meeting. In the Privacy Notice, remove the comma in "We may also, send you information" in the "What are we doing with your information?" section. Remove the date that the document was started.  Induction documents:  Kerry shared the draft steering group induction document. The induction pack should include information about the general steering group role, the chair role, a description of the IASK service and future meeting dates. It would also be good to have a letter thanking people for their interest in the steering group. Siobhan, Sue and Claire offered to help with video clips for the steering group induction.  Development for next financial year: Some of the targets for the next year require input from service users such as the service video and increasing the amount of information on the IASK website. Kerry would like to increase the number of parents on the steering group. The service will be working with Claire Tanton on driving forward the SEND young person forum. The service has recruited a new Family Involvement Worker as part of the designated keyworker programme. Kerry would like to upskill the whole teams to support with mental health related queries.
